

Rifle and Pistol Range Policy

Range Safety Officers are provided to maintain a safe, clean and professional shooting facility. They are volunteers, and are generously donating their time. They have been trained to manage shooting activities at the Redmond Rod and Gun Club, and to respond to any emergency situation that may arise. They do not write club policy or make the rules. Your decision to become a member of this club implies that you have read the rules and agree to follow the direction of the Range Safety Officers. Questions or concerns regarding club policy will be addressed by the Board of Directors. The board meets on the first Monday of each month, at 6:30 pm in the clubhouse. They can also be contacted via contact information posted at the range or on our website, www.rrandgc.com.

The use of any target not outlined here is strictly forbidden. Additional targets may be considered by the board of directors. Junior shooters under the age of 18 **may not** shoot without direct adult supervision.

1. Upon completion of use, shooters will clean up their area and remove all targets, spent cartridge casings or other debris. Disposal containers have been provided and shooters are expected to deposit debris into the appropriate container (ie. duds, brass casings, steel casings, garbage can).
2. Ground level targets are not permitted. The club provides target frames in order to maintain proper elevation of targets. These target frames are meant to control projectile impact into a safe area. Use the appropriate target frame for the distance and lane you are shooting.
3. Paper or cardboard targets are approved.
4. Prefabricated steel targets designed specifically for target shooting, up to their specified caliber are approved. Appropriate caution must be taken to reduce the potential for ricochets by elevating the target.
5. Clay targets (for trap) may be used for pistol or rifle, all debris must be removed.
6. Shotgun shooting at the plywood target holders is **not** permitted.
7. Tracer rounds are **not** permitted.
8. Fully automatic firearms are **not** permitted.
9. Semi-auto firearms are permitted. However, shooters must control or block the ejection path of spent casings so as not to disrupt adjacent shooters.
10. The use of muzzle brakes is permitted. However, care must be taken to prevent injury or disruption of adjacent shooters.
11. Alcohol is **not** permitted on the rifle / pistol ranges.
12. Please be courteous to other shooters and avoid disruptive behavior.
